Macclesfield, a beautiful historic market town dating back to 1261 when the town was granted a charter by Edward the First, occupies an enviable position along the River Bolin, the edge of the rolling Cheshire Plain to the west and the Peak District National Park to the east. Living here is opportunity to explore breathtaking countryside, rivers, canals, reservoirs and woodland, all within easy reach via scenic country drives.

Complementing its beautiful rural setting, the history of the town is prominent in its cobbled streets and architecture, including Macclesfield Castle, the Town Hall and the Heritage Centre. Macclesfield became a silk-manufacturing centre from the mid-18th century and was also home to Hovis breadmakers at Publicity Works Mill (commonly referred to as "the Hovis Mill") on the canal close to Buxton Road.













# HISTORY WITH COMMUNITY AT ITS HEART

Today, Macclesfield draws visitors from surrounding areas for its wealth of festivals and cultural events such as Macclesfield Festival, Macc Pride, Rewind North, Macclesfield Beer Festival.

Every last Sunday of the month the cobbled streets of Macclesfield Marketplace play host to the artisan Treacle Market, named after an incident in Medieval times when a horse-drawn wagon overturned and spilt its load of treacle onto the street, providing fabled respite to the poor, who joyously scooped the treacle off the road.

The Treacle Market is one of the largest Artisan Markets in the North West, celebrating its 14th year in Summer 2024. It offers over 140 stalls of exceptional quirky unique artworks, antiques, books, vintage finds, delicious food & drink and stalls hosted by many local community groups.













As well as the expected choice of pubs, bars and restaurants in the town centre, there is also a wide selection of traditional country pubs located around the rural outskirts of the town.

In Macclesfield you'll be spoilt for choice regarding sports and culture, with many special interest groups thriving in the community, including Chess, Running, Cycling, Hockey and Football, with Macclesfield Town FC gaining league status in 1997.

The Heritage Centre houses a small-scale cinema and art-house, and there is a thriving amateur dramatics scene, with productions at the Heritage Centre, the Evans Theatre in Wilmslow and the MADS Theatre on Lord Street. Gawsworth Hall hosts an annual Shakespeare festival as well as many arts and music events throughout the year.




### AMENITIES & ATTRACTIONS


The Old School House is well-placed for local amenities such as Macclesfield Leisure Centre (8 min drive) and Macclesfield Golf Club (1 mile, 4 min drive)

For walking, cycling and hiking, there is a vast choice of places to explore with younger children and grandchildren, all within easy, spectacular country drives:

Macclesfield is served by four state-funded academies (previously state high schools):

- Tytherington School
   1 mile, 20 mins walk
- The Macclesfield Academy 2 miles, 30 mins walk, 25 mins bus
- Fallibroome Academy 2.6 miles, 35 mins bus
- All Hallows Catholic College.1.6 miles, 28 mins bus

There is also an independent school:

Beech Hall School1.2 miles, 23 min walk



With an excellent public transport system on your doorstep, it's easy to give teenagers the freedom to explore and enjoy local areas and nearby cities. Macclesfield bus station, only a ten minute walk away, offers 15 bus routes within the town and further afield including Congleton, Wilmslow, Knutsford, Stockport, Crewe, Buxton, Altrincham, and Chatsworth House.

Alternately, Macclesfield train station is only half a mile away – a ten minute walk through the park from The Old School House, where regular services run to Stockport, Manchester, Stoke-on-Trent, Stafford, London and Birmingham.

Housing 27 bespoke apartments, in The Old School House no two dwellings are the same. Use the floorplates on the following pages to view the locations of 1, 2 and 3 bed apartments and maisonettes.

#### Kitchen & Utility






#### Rail:

Macclesfield station – (half a mile-10 min walk through the park from The Old School House) is on the Stafford to Manchester branch of the West Coast Main Line. Avanti West Coast operates regular services to:

- Manchester Piccadilly (20 mins)
- Stoke-on-Trent (15 minutes)
- London Euston (1 hour 47 minutes)



#### Bus:

Macclesfield Bus station (0.7 miles – 15 min walk) Fifteen bus routes run within the town and to other locations including Congleton, Wilmslow, Knutsford, Stockport, Crewe, Buxton, Altrincham, Wythenshawe and Chatsworth House.



#### Airports:

- Manchester (13 miles, 25 mins)
- Liverpoool John Lennon (44 miles, 1 hour)
